# GENERAL INFORMATION

**AREA LOCATION:** The Guide to the Campus, back cover, indicates building numbers which will be shown through the program in brackets — e.g. Union (9).

**INFORMATION:** The main information centre is at the reception desk, ground floor, Union (9). Other information posts may be found at approaches to the central area. Student guides in academic gowns will be on hand at various points around the campus to answer questions.

**PROGRAM CHANGES:** The Information Centre at the Union Desk will provide details of additional items or program changes that came to light after this guide went to press.

**LOST CHILDREN** should be taken to the Information Centre. If young children wear labels their names can readily be given over the public address system.

**LOST PROPERTY CENTRE** is also at the Union Information Centre. Inquiries after Open Day may be made by phoning 541 0811, ext. 3146.

**UNION FACILITIES:** Open on the day are the Bookshop, 10 a.m.-5 p.m., the Union Shop, 10 a.m.-5 p.m. (sweets, tobacco, souvenirs); the Pharmacy, 10 a.m.-5 p.m.; the Pantry, 11 a.m.-3 p.m.; and catering as follows: Grill Room (10.30 a.m.-5 p.m.), Small Cafe (10 a.m.-5 p.m.), Hamburger Bar (11 a.m.-3 p.m.), Espresso Bar and Main Dining Room (11.30 a.m.-2 p.m.).

**FIRST AID POST:** An emergency post and emergency vehicle will be manned by St John Ambulance volunteers and located between the Main Library (4) and Rotunda (7). Arrangements have been made for emergency backup medical service. Visitors are urged to observe normal safety precautions on a crowded occasion, especially in buildings with scientific and technical equipment. Telephone extension for emergency service is 3333.

**PUBLIC TELEPHONES:** Are mainly located in the Union ground floor, eastern end (9) and the basement of the Humanities Building (10).

**CONVENIENCES:** Are mainly in the Union, both floors (9), and the Humanities Building basement (10).

**BUS TOURS** of the University grounds will be conducted half-hourly between 10.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. The buses, supplied by Grenda, Ventura, and Sinclair's buslines will leave from the loop near the Alexander Theatre (6) and make regular calls at the Halls of Residence. A student guide will point out the features of the University.

**EDUCATIONAL ADVISORY SERVICES:** The Careers Counsellor (Prospective Students) and other counselling staff will be in attendance in the Careers and Appointments Office, first floor, eastern end of the Union Building (9), and the Student Financial Adviser and the Housing Officer will also be in the C & A Office.

and guidance in Science faculty advisory centre — 1st year Physics (25).

#### ECONOMICS AND POLITICS (10)

Through the day the Faculty Secretary and teaching staff from the various departments will be available to give advice on the 'Ecops' degree or on particular subjects and courses in the degree. Locations of the advisory centres will be displayed in the foyer of the Humanities Building (10) and through the Departments.

Counselling will be available: On accounting, commercial law and business finance in Room 253, 2nd floor, Humanities (10); on administrative studies, economics courses, economic history courses, econometrics, operations research, and economic statistics courses in the 2nd floor foyer, Humanities (10); on the courses in politics in Room 358, 3rd floor, Humanities (10). Forum on 'The transition from HSC politics to university politics' will be held from 2.15 p.m. — 3.15 p.m. in Lecture Theatre H3, Humanities Building (10).

Faculty Library will be open to visitors 11 a.m. — 3 p.m., 1st floor, Humanities (10).

#### EDUCATION (5), (44), (10) & (7)

The Faculty of Education conducts postgraduate courses. A roster of staff will be available throughout the day to meet and talk with visitors (5).

Children's TV — Have your say about a program for children. Test view an episode of 'The Tomorrow People' (Produced by Thames Television, and available by courtesy of HSV 7). Find out if you'd like to see it on TV at home. Sessions start each hour from 11 a.m. Last viewing at 4 p.m. During each session in ground floor Room G04, Education Building (5) visitors view, discuss and record their opinions of the program.

Focus on the problems of Migrant Education will be featured by the Centre for Migrant Studies in Room 603 Humanities (10), and in a talk by Mr. Al Grassby at 2.30 p.m. in Rotunda Theatre R1 (7).

The Krongold Centre for Exceptional Children (44) will be open to visitors for 12 minutes before and after the tours of inspection, which take place at: 10 a.m., 11.30 a.m., 1 p.m., 2.30 p.m., and 4 p.m. Each tour will be limited to 40-50 persons and the Centre is locked between tours.

The Television Studio, Room 135, Education Building (5) will be open from 10 a.m. — 12.30 p.m., and 2 p.m. — 4 p.m. Staff will be in attendance to explain and operate the equipment.

The Elwyn Morey Child Study Centre Kindergarten will have information and displays of children's work from 10 a.m. — 1 p.m. in Room G77, Education (5).

On the 4th floor of Education (5) the Centre for Research into Aboriginal Affairs will have displays and information all day and the Education Science Laboratory will have displays all day in Room G25, Education Building (5).



#### **ENGINEERING — Chemical, Building 5 (31)**

Continuously operating displays of teaching equipment and research projects, covering such areas as processing of fuels and energy conservation, processing of minerals, chemicals, foodstuffs, and the treatment of wastes. Course and careers advice will be available.

Films on selections from the above topics will be shown, starting 12 noon, for the remainder of the day in Room G14, ground floor, building 5 in the Engineering complex (31).

#### **ENGINEERING — Civil, Building 5 (31)**

Continuous displays of teaching equipment and research projects. Staff on duty for counselling and information. Location — Civil Engineering Laboratories, building 5 in the Engineering complex (31).

#### **ENGINEERING — Electrical, Buildings 4, 5 and 6 (30 & 31)**

In Engineering Building 4 displays include: electrical machines, electromagnetic devices in machines, laboratory building 4, Room G02. Power system simulation, network analyser, in Power Systems Laboratory, building 4, Room G19 (30). In second year laboratory, 1st floor — giant meters, second year experiments, and control exhibits, including system simulation, control systems, micro-processors, computer games, building 4, Room 104 (30).

On 2nd floor, building 4, electronics and communications laboratory Room 220 — digital and analogue integrated circuits, analogue/digital converter, modulation/demodulation equipment, phasor display; microwave laboratory, Room 226-microwave security device, microwave communication, examples of microwave propagation (30).

In Engineering Building 5 (31), ground floor: student advisory area — staff will be present to discuss the electrical engineering course with prospective students.

In Engineering Building 6 (30) High voltage Laboratory, ground floor Room G1B — high voltage display.

#### **ENGINEERING — Materials, Buildings 5 and 6 (30 & 31)**

General display of department's activities with emphasis on electron microscopes. Both scanning and transmission electron microscopes will be operating — Engineering Building 6, Room 118 (30). Also optical microscopes with CCTV observation of quartz crystal watch mechanisms — Engineering Building 6, Room 105 (30). Levitation melting of aluminium will be demonstrated throughout the day — Engineering Building 5, Room 178 (31).

Counselling and information: Academic staff will be available all day in the department to give details of the B.E. course in Materials Engineering and for general counselling of students.

#### **ENGINEERING — Mechanical, Building 5 (31)**

All laboratory areas will be open for displays, and staff will be on duty all day for counselling and information.

The Wind Tunnel will operate every half-hour on first floor, Building 5 (31).

Special display on the historical developments of aqueducts; a range of instrument displays in Dynamics Research Laboratory; hydraulic models in the wind tunnel area; various semi-static displays in the Applied Mechanics Laboratory; solar energy devices in Thermodynamics Laboratory; wave tanks showing beach processes, hydraulic turbines, etc.; static display on sheet metal forming processes. (31).

#### **ENGLISH (10) & (7)**

There will be corridor displays and a counselling and advisory service on the 7th and 8th floors, Humanities Building (10). From 2.30 p.m. — 4 p.m. there will be a Lecture/Demonstration of the Storm Scenes from 'King Lear' by Shakespeare — one of the HSC literature texts, Rotunda Theatre R3 (7).

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE (25)**

Display of research studies currently being undertaken by Master of Environmental Science students, solar energy technology display and information service all day. Location — Common Room, 1st floor (above the 1st Year Physics laboratories) (25).

#### **EPICURES CLUB (9)**

A club to cultivate taste and please the palate. Pate, cheese and wine tasting, and a food preparation display between 12 noon and 2 p.m. in the Banquet Room, Union (9).

#### **EVANGELICAL UNION (9)**

One of the religious clubs on campus is arranging a 'street theatre concert' and a talk from 1 p.m.-2 p.m. in the upstairs foyer — Union (9).

#### **FELLOWSHIP OF MIDDLE EARTH — FORUM, Between (9) & (10)**

FOME, our Tolkien society, has organised a Nazgul hunt in the Forum for your amusement, from 1.30 p.m. — 3 p.m. The 'hunters' will be roaming the Union all day and a 'flying dragon' will be launched from Building 10 at lunchtime. There is a 'Hobbit afternoon tea' between 1.30 p.m. and 4 p.m. in the Forum, or if wet, in the foyer, 1st floor Union (9). Information table upstairs foyer (9) all day.

#### **FENCING (9)**

Club grading competition in foil, sabre and epee, and discussion on aspects of the sport. 10 a.m. — 4.30 p.m. in the Cellar Room, Union (9).

Displays — Genetics of antibiotic resistance; genetic changes in population; cloning; locating Lily genes; measuring evolution; also information and counselling in 1st Year Biology/Zoology laboratories 10 a.m. — 5 p.m. (18). Films (each about 25 minutes duration) on the theme 'Genetics and Man', between 11 a.m. — 1 p.m., and 2 p.m. — 4 p.m. in Lecture Theatre S7 (19). Academic staff present to answer questions after each film.

#### **GERMAN (10)**

Displays — Old and new German books for children and learners; posters; German music; information and counselling 9.30 a.m. — 5 p.m. in Room 310, 3rd floor Humanities (10). Slides and talk by Assoc. Prof. Veit on 'Medieval Germany' 11.30 a.m. — 12.15 p.m. in Language Laboratory 3, on 3rd floor, south wing, Humanities (10). Film about Primary School German (30 minutes) to be shown at 10.15 a.m., 11.30 a.m., and 4.15 p.m. in Room S321 (Language Laboratory 6) on 3rd floor, south wing, Humanities (10).

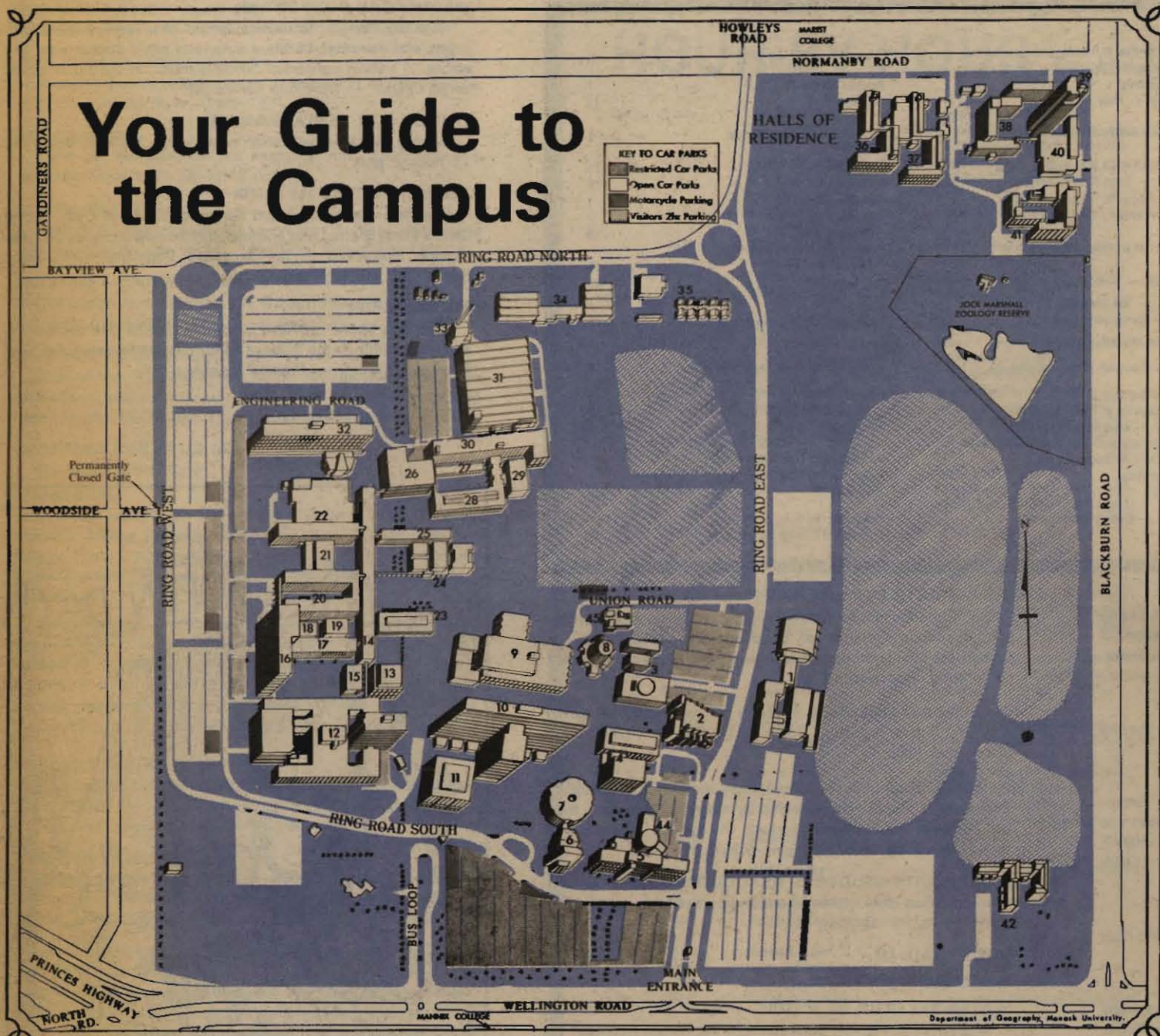
