ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Before proceeding to the online application system you will be required to undergo a preliminary assessment of your eligibility to apply for admission.

The preliminary assessment will include: an assessment of your academic qualifications, and your prior research experience, not; the availability of academic staff with the necessary expertise to supervise your research project; and the availability of facilities and resources within the academic unit.

The preliminary assessment is for Monash Business School to determine whether your qualifications will meet the University's admission criteria, and if so determined, you will receive a formal invitation to apply for admission.

You must obtain an 'Invitation to Apply' before proceeding via the online system at:

Please note that the invitation does not constitute an offer of enrolment and does not guarantee a place in the program.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT

Please provide scanned copies of the following documentation:

- Academic qualifications (all) including certificates, transcripts, grading scales
- Examiners, reports for thesis/dissertation, if appropriate
- Evidence of academic publications, if appropriate
- Evidence of academic awards/prizes, if appropriate
- Details of your proficiency in English (current IELTS/ TOEFL test results)
- Curriculum vitae
- Research proposal (approximately five pages).

SCHOLARSHIPS

Opportunities to apply for scholarships to support tuition and/or living expenses are available in four rounds.

The Monash scholarship process is highly competitive and Monash Business School supports only applicants who hold First Class academic qualifications.

If you hope to secure a scholarship, it is recommended that you start the process no later than one month prior to scholarship closing dates.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (PHD)

- A bachelor's degree requiring at least four years of full-time study in a relevant field, and which normally includes a research component in the fourth year, leading to an Honours 1 or 2A in a relevant field;
- 2. A course leading to a level rated by the relevant department, faculty and committee as equivalent to an Honours 1 or 2A in a relevant field;
- 3. A master's degree that entails work, normally including a significant research component, including at least 25% of one full time equivalent year of work, including a thesis. It is normally expected that a grade of Honours 2A has been obtained for the research thesis or project. Where ungraded, examiners' reports will be taken into account; or
- Have qualifications which in the opinion of the Graduate Research Committee are deemed equivalent.
